

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
TEMPORARY FOOTPATH CLOSURES OAL 40 AND OHS 34
(PARISHES OF HAM AND STONE AND ALKINGTON) (STROUD DISTRICT)
SPECIAL EVENT ORDER 2022

WHEREAS the Gloucestershire County Council ("the Council") being the Traffic Authority for the public footpaths in the Parishes of Ham & Stone and Alkington as defined in the schedule below ("the Footpaths") is satisfied that use of the Footpaths should be prohibited for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event, namely the Berkeley Hunt Point to Point Meeting 2022 ("the Event").

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of its powers under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended by the Road Traffic Regulation (Special Events) Act 1994), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. Except for pedestrian access to properties, no person shall proceed along the Footpaths during the Event;
2. The Footpaths fall within the Parishes of Ham and Stone and Alkington in the Stroud District in the County of Gloucestershire:
2. This Order shall come into force on the 23rd day of April Two Thousand and Twenty Two, and shall continue in force for a period not exceeding three days;
3. This Order may be cited as the "Gloucestershire County Council Temporary Footpath Closures OAL 40 and OHS 34 (Parishes of Ham & Stone and Alkington) (Stroud District) Special Event Order 2022".

THE SCHEDULE

Public Footpath OAL 40 is to be closed from its junction with Matford Bridge running generally south south-easterly for approximately 1330 metres to its connection with Matford Lane and then the A38 at Woodford.

Public Footpath OHS 34 is to be closed from its junction with public footpath OHS 35 running generally south-easterly and then crossing the river to connect with the also closed footpath OAL 40.
